# Critical Edge Alliance (CEA) – An Introduction

The Critical Edge Alliance is based upon collaboration among institutions that consider themselves as alternatives to conventional higher education and are dedicated to progressive and innovative forms of teaching and research. The alliance aims to become a global collaborative framework for universities that focus open student-centered learning, critical thinking, interdisciplinary teaching, research and social engagement.

Currently seven institutions from six countries participate in this work: The New School (USA), Al Akhawayn University (Morocco), Evergreen State College (USA), Tata Institute of Social Science (India), Universidad de los Andes (Colombia), Pontifícia Universidade Católica do Rio de Janerio (Brazil), and Roskilde University (Denmark). We aim to include more institutions over time. Through the Critical Edge Alliance, we not only seek to create a new global community of learning and research aimed at promoting critical and innovative approaches to higher education, but also aim to promote:

- Higher education as an instrument of democratic participation, social inclusion and social justice. It should encourage students to become active citizens of their country as well as of the world at large.
- Human understanding and empathy across national, ethnic, cultural, and religious differences through critical higher education.
- Collaboration and partnerships of knowledge exploration, between university and society, between academic disciplines and between professors and students.
- Students as active learners and individuals, who are responsible for their own development.
- The idea of combining practice and theory to solve real problems in the world and encourage

# **Important Guidelines for Students**

- 1. Students who are interested have to first submit an abstract (should not exceed 800 words). The abstract could be of **a paper**, **video**, **poster**, etc. related to:
  - An experiment of University- Society partnerships undertaken by you or your institution.
  - An experience of such partnership highlighting the value of learning and practice.
  - A sample curriculum/ module (including innovative ideas) for higher education keeping in context the theme of University- Society partnerships.
  - A students' conceptualisation or perspective on University- Society partnerships and the value of the same in higher education.
- 2. There is no compulsion to limit the abstract within the three sub- themes of the conference. However, the broad theme should remain as University- Society partnerships.
- 3. Student panels would be formed based on the themes (probably 3 to 4) emerging from the shortlisted abstracts and students coming under the same theme would work together during the workshop at TISS to develop a common presentation. These student panels would then present their outcome of the two-day workshop at the conference.
- 4. The abstracts need to be send to ceatissabstracts2017@tiss.edu in the <u>prescribed</u> format. The last day for the submission of the abstract is 6 July 2017 and the students will be intimated of their selection by 14 July 2017.
- 5. We are expecting the students who get shortlisted to arrive in time for the workshop so that they will have time to work together towards the presentation.
- 6. Only selected students are expected to attend. We are expecting 3 to 4 students from each partner university with a maximum limit of 30 to 35 students.
